PENTELEDATA IS PROUD TO SERVE DUNCANNON, PA

The Duncannon Borough is located in Perry County, Pennsylvania. The small town of about 1,500 people is situated at the confluence of the Susquehanna and Juniata rivers and is known for its views from Hawk Rock as well as the friendliness and hospitality of its residents. Nestled in the Appalachian Mountains, the area is popular for its hiking trails and for watching bird migrations. Though it is a small community, it is full of life and charm. The people in Duncannon are friendly and welcoming. The locals enjoy spending time outdoors taking advantage of the pristine hiking trails and natural beauty of their surroundings. There are also plenty of locally owned restaurants and shops with unique offerings.

Founded in 1792 as Petersburg, the community that later bore the name of Duncannon was incorporated in 1865. Duncannon has a history rich in transportation, with ferries, Conestoga wagons, canals, railroads, and highways all playing important roles in the development of the area. Possibly Duncannon's most significant role was that of a transportation hub and trading crossroads that helped thousands of pioneers and traders move westward into western Pennsylvania and the Ohio River Valley during the 18th and 19th centuries.

Unlike many small towns, the resilient Duncannon is also largely self-reliant when it comes to financing. The borough self-finances most of its own projects, thanks to its ownership of nearly 2,000 acres of a nearby watershed. It timbers

small sections of the land every two years and puts the revenue into its timber fund. The fund helps finance municipal projects and equipment, including an electric line truck, a garbage truck and two pickup trucks.

THE NEW TRAINING CENTER AT COCA-COLA PARK IS A HOME RUN!

Since the IronPigs inception in 2008, they have never finished lower than eighth in Minor League Baseball in total or average attendance and have ranked within the top-5 in both categories 12 out of 15 seasons. They're planning to continue those records for the 2024 season, especially with the completion of their renovations. Major League Baseball required Minor League stadiums to make some significant upgrades and failure to do so could have resulted in non-compliance, potentially ending their affiliation. In fact, it's worth noting that prior to 2021 there were 162 total Minor League Baseball teams. Currently, there are 120 Minor League teams.

The new and renovated training area is called the St. Luke's Sports Training Center. The project renovated existing player clubhouses and the athletic training areas of 16-year-old Coca-Cola Park as well as adding significantly more space to the area. Those improvements, including clubhouse and training room expansion, female staff locker rooms, improvement of stadium lighting, and the addition of batting/pitching tunnels are complete. PenTeleData is proud to have helped support their efforts. We appreciate both St. Luke's and the Lehigh Valley IronPigs for being tremendous assets to the communities we serve.

The IronPigs plan to kick off the 2024 season on Friday, March 29th, hosting the Worcester WooSox at home.
